4mm crochet hook



Large pink yarn (55 yds)



10mm safety eyes



Small pink yarn (28 yds)



Tapestry needle



Purple yarn (28 yds)



Stuffing



Stitch markers




Scissors (not included)



Sewing pins

HOW TO READ AN AMIGO RUMI PATTERN



For round 4, repeat the pattern in the brackets 6 times.

The pattern is: single crochet in each one of the next 2 stitches, then an increase stitch (2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch of the previous round).

The total number of stitches in this round is 24.



This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in continuous rounds.

rnd

round

sc

single crochet

inc

increase (2 sc in the same stitch)

dec

decrease

chain



- Place a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round to mark the start of the round.
- Count the number of stitches at the end of each round to ensure there are no mistakes.
- In case of a mistake, carefully undo the stitches and fix the mistake. Once the round is completed, recount the stitches before moving on to the next round.
- Encountered a knot in the yarn?
 - If the knot is located on the inner side of the dinosaur, continue to crochet as normal and ignore it.
 - If the knot is located on the front side of the dinosaur, cut the yarn right before and after the knot, and tie a new knot so that it stays on the inner side of the dinosaur.
- To keep track of your progress, it is recommended to place a check mark next to the corresponding line in the instructions after you finish each round.



Your kit contains three balls of yarn:



Small pink ball



Large pink ball



Purple ball

Use them as follows:

- Use the pink yarn to create the head, body, arms, tail, horns, and the edge of the frill.
- Use the purple yarn to create the belly stripes and the frill (except for its edge).

HEAD & BODY

With pink yarn.

HEAD

TIP Keep track of where you are by placing a stitch marker in the first stitch of the current round.

Rnd 1: Start 6 sc in a magic loop (6)

Rnd 2: 6 inc (12)

Rnd 3: [sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: [2 sc, inc] x 6 (24)

Rnd 5: 4 sc, 1 inc, 4 sc, 6 inc, 4 sc, 1 inc, 4 sc (32)

Rnd 6: 10 sc, [sc, inc] x 6, 10 sc (38)

Rnd 7: 6 sc, 2 inc, 22 sc, 2 inc, 6 sc (42)

Rnd 8: 42 sc (42)

Rnd 9: 6 sc, 2 dec, 22 sc, 2 dec, 6 sc (38)

Rnd 10: 38 sc (38)

Rnd 11: 10 sc, [sc, dec] x 6, 10 sc (32)

Rnd 12: 5 sc, dec, 3 sc, 6 dec, 3 sc, dec, 5 sc (24) Rnd 13: dec. [2sc. dec] x 2, 3 dec. [2sc. dec] x 2 (16)

Rnd 14: 16 sc (16)

Attach the eyes to the front side of the head, between rounds 6 and 7, with a 22-stitch space between them, and stuff the head with acrylic filling. If this amigurumi is for a baby or pet, embroider the eyes instead. For guidance on embroidering the eyes, watch our videos.

BODY

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Rnd 15: [3 sc, inc] x 4 (20)
Rnd 16: [4 sc, inc] x 4 (24)
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Rnd 17: 7 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 7 sc (26) Rnd 18: 8 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 8 sc (28) Rnd 19: 9 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 9 sc (30) Rnd 20: 9 sc, [sc, inc] x 6, 9 sc (36) Rnd 21: 9 sc, [2 sc, inc] x 6, 9 sc (42)

Rnd 22: 42 sc (42)

Rnd 23: 42 sc (42) Rnd 24: 42 sc (42)

Rnd 25: [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36) Rnd 26: [4 sc, dec] x 6 (30) Rnd 27: [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24) Rnd 28: [2 sc, dec] x 6 (18)

Stuff the body with acrylic filling.

Rnd 29: [sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Rnd 30: 6 dec (6)

Fasten off leaving about a 4-inch yarn tail to be used for closing the dinosaur. Thread a needle with the yarn tail and use it to pull the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch. Pull tight to close the remaining gap, then hide the remaining yarn tail within the body of the dinosaur.

ARMS

With pink yarn (make two).

TIP Keep track of where you are by placing a stitch marker in the first stitch of the current round.

Rnd 1: Start 6 sc in a magic loop (6)

Rnd 2: [sc, inc] x 3 (9)

Rnd 3: 9 sc (9)

Fasten off leaving about a 4-inch yarn tail. Thread a needle with the yarn tail and sew the arm to the dinosaur between rounds 16-18, with a six-stitch space between them. Hide the remaining yarn tail within the body of the dinosaur.

TAIL

With pink yarn.

Keep track of where you are by placing a stitch marker in the first stitch of the current round.

Rnd 1: Start 4 sc in a magic loop (4)

Rnd 2: [sc. inc] x 2 (6)

Rnd 3: [2 sc, inc] x 2 (8) Rnd 4: 4 sc. inc. 3 sc (9)

Rnd 5: 4 sc. inc. 4 sc (10)

Rnd 6: 5 sc. inc. 4 sc (11)

Rnd 7: 5 sc. inc. 5 sc (12)

Rnd 8: 5 sc. 2 inc. 5 sc (14)

Rnd 9: 6 sc, 2 inc, 6 sc (16)

Stuff the tail with acrylic filling. Fasten off leaving about a 4-inch yarn tail. Thread a needle with the yarn tail and sew the tail piece to the middle of the dinosaur's back, starting at round 22. Make sure that the inclined part of the dinosaur tail, which is the side opposite the yarn tail, is facing up. Hide the remaining varn tail within the body of the dinosaur.

FRILL

- Use the purple yarn ball for rounds 1-4 and the small pink yarn ball for round 5.
- In each row start crocheting from the second stitch.
- At the end of each row, make a chain stitch and turn the dinosaur to continue crocheting in the same direction.

Start by creating 31 chain stitches and follow the next steps:

Row 1: 30 sc (30)

Row 2: [inc, 3 sc, inc] x 6 (42)

Row 3: [inc, 5 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

Row 4: [inc, 7 sc, inc] x 6 (66)

Row 5: [inc, 9 sc, inc] x 6 (78)

 We recommend attaching the frill only after attaching the horns.

HORN

With pink yarn (make two).

Rnd 1: 6 sc to a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: 6 sc (6)

Rnd 3: [inc, sc] x 3 (9)

Rnd 4: 9 sc (9) Rnd 5: 9 sc (9) Rnd 6: 9 sc (9) Rnd 7: 9 sc (9)

Fasten off leaving about a 4-inch yarn tail. Thread a needle with the yarn tail and sew the horn to the front part of the dinosaur's head between rounds 2-4, with a five-stitch space between them. Hide the remaining yarn tail within the body of the dinosaur. We recommend attaching the horns before attaching the frill.

BELLY STRIPES



With purple yarn.

Thread a needle with a 24-inch length of yarn. Use it to embroider three belly stripes in horizontal lines. Start with the top stripe.

Make the top stripe in the middle of the dinosaur's hands spanning rounds 17-18, over a width of 3 stitches.

Make the middle stripe spanning rounds 19-20, over a width of 8 stitches.

Make the bottom stripe spanning rounds 20-21, over a width of 13 stitches.

Step 1.

Insert the needle at the point marked as number 1 in the diagram (positioned between rounds 17-18). Bring it out after 3 stitches on the left side in the same row, at the point marked as number 2. Do not pull all the yarn through, but leave about a 4-inch of yarn outside the dinosaur.

Step 2.

Insert the needle at the point marked as number 1 in the diagram. Bring it out at the point marked as number 3 (positioned between rounds 19-20) and pull all the yarn through.

Step 3.

Insert the needle at the point marked as number 4 (positioned 8 stitches on the right in the same row). Bring it out at the point marked as number 5 (positioned between rounds 21-22) and pull all the yarn through.

Step 4.

Insert the needle at the point marked as number 6 (positioned 13 stitches on the right in the same row). Bring it out at a different area on the belly. Pull all the yarn through. Cut off the remaining yarn and hide the yarn tail within the body of the dinosaur.

Step 5.

Hide the yarn tail that was left on the right side of the top stripe (at the point marked as number 1); Thread a needle with the yarn tail. Insert the needle at the point marked as number 1. Bring it out at a different area on the belly. Pull all the yarn through. Cut off the remaining yarn and hide the yarn tail within the body of the dinosaur.
